How can I help CEF reach more children for Christ?

That's the question I've asked myself since I began in this ministry decades ago. When I first became president of CEF in 1989, we reached nearly two million children annually. That number skyrocketed to over 25 million in 2019—the year before COVID spread around the world. It takes an army of child evangelists to reach so many children. Our founder, Mr. Overholzer, prayed over his globe for God to raise up such an army. As God told us in Luke 10:2—we've also continued to pray that He would send more workers. And He has!

CEF has a staff of close to 3,500 with 96 percent who are nationals. In addition, hundreds of thousands of volunteers work with CEF staff to share the Gospel with children around the world. Many more pray and give. When I look at so many people from diverse cultures working together to reach the boys and girls of the world for Christ, I know it is God who is doing this work.

One of my greatest joys has been getting to know the CEF family and hearing their stories of God's wondrous


works. In this edition of *Impact* magazine, you'll find stories from around the globe. Children are coming to Jesus, impacting their parents, and witnessing to their friends.





New Laptops for Gypsy Camps

Our co-worker, Mike Petkof, used to teach children in 7 to 10 Gypsy camps a month. When COVID restrictions kept Mike from visiting the Gypsy camps, he decided to raise money to buy laptops. He uploaded our 40-plus Bible videos and gave a Gypsy believer in each camp a laptop to show the videos to the children. This made it possible for boys and girls with no internet access to enjoy CEF video Bible lessons.

WHEN I GROW UP...

Alex lives with two sisters and his aunt. His father died a few years ago of a serious illness and the family was left without wages. They live in a one-room apartment and sleep on the floor. It is very cold in the winter because there is no heating. At *Good News Club*, the children were asked, "Who would you like to be when you grow up?" Alex answered, "I want to be the pastor in the district."

Children Reaching Children

MEET THE KING!

Rudra's* family was discouraged. Their economic situation filled them with despair. Life was so hard his parents decided to commit suicide with all his family members. While Rudra was walking on the street, someone handed him *Meet the King!*—a Gospel booklet in one of the languages of India. He read it and then shared it with his siblings. Eventually he gave it to his parents. As his father read it, he realized, "This God is the real true God. We must believe in Jesus Christ." They decided not to commit suicide and instead went to church. Rudra's father said to the pastor, "I read this book. Is it true?" The pastor explained more about the Gospel and the whole family believed in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior.

Trained and equipped nationals are the ideal individuals to minister to children in their countries. They already speak the language, know the culture, and can work where people of other nations are not welcomed.



Since 1972 the *Sponsor-A-National™* program has provided financial assistance to trained nationals who live in areas where it is difficult to raise support. Presently over 1,100 CEF national missionaries receive assistance through the SPAN™ program each month. This enables them to spend more time sharing the Good News about Jesus with the children.

In the village of Sokou in the district of Saketé, the villagers saw *Child Evangelism Fellowship* missionaries enter the village with the Gospel for children. There is no Christian witness in this place, only idol worship.

The villagers started casting spells and cursed the missionaries for bringing a strange God to them. They hated this new God called Jesus and wanted the child evangelists to leave them as a result of the spells and curses put on them. After a while, nothing happened to the *CEF* workers which made the villagers wonder, for they trusted their powers.

The villagers approached the child evangelists to inquire as to the source of their power, which withstood their gods. Their response: JESUS. The villagers confessed, “You have the most powerful God and we need Him here.”

Now a church has started in the village of Sokou. The children in the area are being reached with the Gospel unhindered.

Thanks be to God for His protection to open a whole new area to the Gospel.


A lady called me a few weeks ago. She didn't know me, but someone told her that she must call me because her elementary-aged daughter had behavior problems. I went to talk with this mother.

I come from an interesting family. My mother knows God, but my dad is a Muslim. Since we were little, I remember my dad allowed my mom to go to church and teach children away from our home. One of my dad's family rules was that we were NOT to go to church. My mother was told she could go to church but not take any of us children with her. There was very little opportunity for us to come to faith because my mom was not even allowed to read the Bible with us at home.

One day, I tagged along with my mom when she taught *Good News Club*. I continued going to GNC™ with her but did not go to church out of obedience to my dad.

One day as my mom taught the Bible lesson at GNC, I realized I was a sinner. That day I put my faith in Christ and became a believer. I was 12 at the time and chose not to tell my dad about this decision. I continued going to GNC and grew to know God better.

When I was 13, my mom asked my dad if I could go to a training for teenagers to learn how to be well mannered and mentor children. Dad agreed. I'm sure he didn't realize it was a Christian gathering and that through *Christian Youth In Action*® I would learn more about God and grow in my faith.


I attended CYIA™ in 2019 and again this year (2021). Now I teach children in *5-Day Club*® and GNC with other teens. It is encouraging to see children learn about God.

I Want to Go Home

An elderly woman from Fiji faithfully attended trainings. She became a devoted teacher who hosted *Good News Club* in her home. Her most regular attendees were her grandchildren.

Grandson Sam accepted Christ as Savior in the *Good News Club*. One day his Sunday school teacher asked the class, “How can you go to heaven?” Sam answered with a strong conviction, “By believing in Jesus!” The teacher was impressed and asked Sam where he learned that. Sam answered, “In *Good News Club*.”

Sam became seriously ill and was diagnosed with Leukemia. In the hospital the doctor tried everything to heal him, but without success. The time came when they were certain Sam would die in a few days. In a weak voice Sam told his father, “Daddy, I want to go home.” So, his father got permission from the hospital to take Sam home. When they arrived home Sam said, “Daddy, I want to go home.” His dad was surprised and thought Sam did not have a clear mind because of his illness. He said, “Sam, you are home.” Sam replied, “Daddy, I want to go to my real home, to heaven.” Then Sam died.

For many years Sam’s grandmother had tried to share the Gospel with her son (Sam’s dad), but he refused to listen. After Sam’s funeral, his father decided the whole family should attend church.



“CEF national workers are very important to us. Many times, they can go places where most foreigners cannot go. For example, I talked with a national who shared that he could take the Gospel into a strong Islamic area. I was very impressed and asked, ‘How can you do that?’ He said, ‘I was born there, and I grew up there. Some of my Islamic neighbors are my friends, so they don’t care.’ When we teach nationals and equip them, they can go anywhere to reach boys and girls.”

It has been difficult to conduct consistent ministry on Nevis, a small Caribbean island nation less than 40 square miles and a population of 10,000. But many have been praying the children will learn about Jesus. Last November over 30 children attended a Christmas Party Club and heard the true Christmas story.


On the neighboring island of St. Kitts, Christmas Party Clubs were held in schools. At one school where CEF staff teach morning devotions, 145 attended the *Light of Life* Christmas Party Club and 10 received Jesus as Savior. Another Party Club was held for 45 students at a school where CEF had been denied access. The 12 students at another Party Club all responded to receive Jesus as Savior.

On August 14, 2021, Haiti experienced a major earthquake that caused widespread damage, killed over 2,000 people, and injured over 12,000. *Do You Wonder Why?* booklets were distributed to help answer tough questions in the midst of tragedy. GOSPEL

The most important thing parents can do for their children is help them come to Christ early in life. And the best way to do that is to live out the Gospel and demonstrate how a relationship with God works in everyday life. The parent/father/child relationship is the pattern God chose for our relationship with Him. A good model of this relationship in the home will bring a child closer to understanding God.

The Gospel message itself involves four essential concepts:

- God the Father and His love for us
- Sin which separates us from God
- Jesus who is the only way to be reconciled to God
- Our response to His love.

These concepts can be demonstrated to infants, toddlers, children, adolescents, and into adulthood.

When you hold children close and speak tender words of comfort, you lay the foundation for them to accept the truth that God knows them and loves them personally. Tell them, “My precious child, your Father God knows

you and loves you. In fact, He knows you even better than I do, and loves you even more than I do.”

Each time you patiently remind children, “That was wrong and these are the consequences,” you demonstrate a standard by which all behavior is judged as right or wrong. That standard of course is God’s Word and His character. Loving, biblical discipline paves the way for the truths that “all have sinned” (Romans 3:23) and “the wages of sin is death” (Romans 6:23). Without the awareness of personal sin and its punishment, children will never see their need for a Savior.

When we love children unconditionally, we demonstrate the truth of God’s unconditional love described in Romans 5:8, “While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.” After disciplining a child, ask, “Do I love you more when you’re good or when you’re bad?” Over time, he should learn to answer, “You love me the same.”

But you might think, *I’m not that perfect*. Tell children that. Don’t be afraid to admit your faults and ask for forgiveness. Point out that God’s love is greater; His wisdom and discipline are perfect.

When you love someone, you want what’s best for them and for them to have a good life and not get hurt. Reminding children of this will help them understand why they can trust and obey you. Let them know, “If you trust and obey me, you will be saved from lots of bad things.” Ultimately, point them to why they can trust and obey God. He is the one who loves them with a perfect love, knows what’s best for them, and has the power to help them. God made the way for their sins to be forgiven through Jesus’ death and resurrection.

The Gospel shows us how to deal with our sin in a healthy way—healthy for us, healthy for others, and healthy for our relationship with God.

Teaching the Gospel in your home, both verbally and more importantly, with demonstration, will most likely cause your children to accept Christ at an early age and understand how a relationship works with God, their Heavenly Father. Walking in good relationship with God can become a way of life before they leave your home, equipping them in the very best way possible for life ahead.


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
